It was resolved that the Minutes of the 2013 AGM be adopted.

NRL / Touch Alliance

In August 2013 a strategic alliance between the National Rugby League and Touch Football Australia was announced ([LINK](#)). In mid-2014 the BCTA became a licensee to the agreement, providing some benefits though not all those (or all the costs) of full affiliation. The chief advantage to date has been improved insurance claims processing. The relationship is still developing and will be monitored to ensure it suits our needs.

Fields

Three more fields have now been floodlit. While the two on the main oval will only be available on special occasions such as grand finals, the lower field will be regularly available during winter season (when there is no cricket pitch to contend with). This will prove valuable for future expansion and any night with make-up games.

Banking

The Association now has a PayPal account and an electronic banking facility with ANZ. These additional options make transactions both small and large easier and more timely.

Carnivals

We successfully ran the Brisbane Church Schools touch carnival on Monday, 19 May at Tennyson. The carnival continues to go from strength to strength, with 36 teams competing across the four divisions.

Our own mixed carnival took place on Saturday, 28 June also at Tennyson with 9 teams nominating. The switch from 2 to 4 divisions was a success, maintaining interest for all teams. Congratulations to 2 Fresh who again won the A grade (their third in a row), defeating our own Bulletproof 4-2 in the final.

The Association also provided referees for the touch football component of the State Youth Games on the Sunshine Coast in June. Regrettably the exposure did not encourage any of the

teams to participate in our own carnival or Tuesday competition. Given that we made a financial loss (c. \$600) on the event it is doubtful whether we will be involved again in future. [LINK](#)

Student Teams

Our decision to offer a discounted \$600.00 team fee for those comprising at least 50% full-time students has proved a success, with a number of university and high school sides now regular competitors.

Secretary's Report

The 2014-15 season has run very smoothly with close competition as evidenced by the semi and grand finals results. The weather has generally been kind with only a few nights washed out. The summer competition had a great run with next to no rain, well not on the Tuesday night anyway, therefore finishing again in the first week in March. We now look forward to the commencement of the 2014 Winter Season on the 21st April.

The decision was made over 12 months to have an all six a side competition. Whilst there were a few members hesitant to make the change, the move has been generally accepted and good competition exists between teams in the same grades. I would like to congratulate the premiers from the summer competition: A grade: Left Wright Out, B grade: Jiggas, C grade: Definitely a Try, D grade: Calvary, and E grade: Heroes. Likewise congratulations also go to our winter winners being Bullet Proof, Tryhards, Peptides, Rangers and Brisbane Christian College.

The numbers of teams participating has been improving with 21 in winter and 22 over Summer teams. The Fields have as always been in good condition and now we have the flood lights to operate another two fields. Hopefully with the addition of these fields we can now expand the competition. A concerted push is on to encourage new teams and younger players so the competition remains vibrant and challenging for all who participate. Further continuing actions have been promoting the competition through the school network via a large email contact list, encouraging through the competition members to bring in friends and new teams, keeping our fees at very competitive rates and offering a discount for student teams.

During the year we have held barbeque nights to bring players together, and will continue with this in the coming season.

In late June we held a carnival which was attended by nine teams. The day went very well, so well done to Chris and all the referees who helped out.

I must also compliment the teams this season as the behaviour was generally great and good sportsmanship exhibited, in nearly all games.

Thanks all the committee members. Together we all contribute and again this year we have worked hard to have a very successful competition. The key to this success is that everyone is willing to chip in utilising our various talents. The committee will continue work hard to promote the competition, reinforcing that we are playing on some of the best playing fields in Brisbane, with the aim of growing Christ's kingdom.

Referee Coordinator's Report

The winter 2014 and summer 2014-15 seasons have not produced any significant changes in the depth and breadth of the team of referees available to the BCTA. Player-referees are still being sought as a valuable commodity for the association, as this will hopefully improve both the availability and consistency of referees at the competition. The tracking of individual referees to teams has continued, albeit not as consistently as I would have liked. Nevertheless, I feel that the process has largely been effective at reducing the frequency at which teams will have the same referee for weeks on end. The standard of refereeing at BCTA fixtures is still quite good, but there is always room for improvement.

Future seasons at the BCTA will continue to have a focus on recruiting within the pool of players in the competition, as well as the development and improvement of our overall refereeing standard. A clarification of variations in rules between our competition (Touch Football Australia) and other competitions such as City Touch and Premier Touch etc. is yet to be drafted. It is my intention that this document will basically be a condensed version of the rules pertaining to actual game play, covering particularly the more obscure and subjective rules of touch football. This document will be helpful for referees and players alike, and I will have a draft for the committee at the 2015 AGM.

Daniel Gramshaw will continue to be engaged in a coaching role for our current referees, and I will seek some assessment resources for him to facilitate some written feedback for referees. I will continue to recruit player-referees from the nominated teams to increase the size of our pool of available referees. With regards to the number of referees, I think it is worth noting that the vast majority of other touch competitions in Brisbane would generally only ever regularly have two referees allocated to A grade competition fixtures, and lower grades will usually be allocated a single referee. Even up to a third of the A grade games played in a standard season would have a single referee. Finals obviously attract a double or triple helping, but during the regular season, BCTA is more generous certainly than the QSM run competitions (City Touch and Premier Touch) though I can't pass comment on the BMTA competitions.

The refereeing fees for the winter 2014 season amounted to \$5544 compared to \$6114 for the summer 2014-15 season. In conclusion, I am very pleased with the current team of referees and their conduct. We will always be looking for improvements, particularly in the available pool of referees and also their experience. This will be a vital part of any expansion of the competition, which with the additional lighting available to us at Tennyson will no doubt become topical in the near future.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT
To the Members

Scope
