#### **Proposed Payment Schedule**

It is proposed that the following pay schedules be adopted from the start of the next season:

- Competitor Director - \$150 per week of competition for first venue, \$50 per week of competition for subsequent venues
- Referee Coordinator - \$30 per week of competition per venue
- Treasurer – annual Honorarium of \$200
- Secretary – annual Honorarium of \$100
- Referees – match fee to increase to \$27 per single referee game (currently \$24), \$20 per dual referee game (currently \$18) and \$16 per triple (currently \$15). Referee fees were last increased in 2010!

- Sin Bin terminology and use
- Offside coming straight back changed
- 3 offences on the line results in Sin Bin to nearest in-goal
- Defence line back 7 metres.

Action: Chris Kelly to send out link to new rules to captains and referees.

### **10.4 Referee's Development**

More mentoring needed. We will contact QTL and try to find out correct contacts so we can understand if training courses available.

### **10.5 Succession Planning**

How do we get more people involved? Chris Kelly to email captains of teams. We will also provide more notice of positions and AGM.

**10.6 Child Welfare Policy**

Geoff Eggins and Chris Kelly to develop a Child Welfare Policy. We need a designated person to be able to be approached should any issues arise. Junior coaches Hannah Jenkins and Phil Dawson need their Blue Cards formally linked to our organisation.

**10.7 Competition Director**

## ***President's Report***

### **Winter season**

Winter season was very successful with 23 teams competing and strong competition across all grades. That number included four relocating teams following the closure of the Richlands touch competition. They quickly adapted to their new surroundings with all four making grand final appearances, and two of them claiming premierships.

### **Summer Season**

The defining event of the year was the advent of the coronavirus and associated restrictions on gatherings which resulted in the last two rounds of summer comp (including the grand finals) being abandoned. Such an event is unprecedented in the Association's history- even during the catastrophic 2011 floods we were able to complete the season, albeit at a different venue. It is to be hoped that the current epidemic will not prove as deadly. In any event the Committee took the decision to award premierships to the leading team in each of the five grades and they are duly acknowledged in the [Honour Board](#) section. Congratulations to them all.

### **Player Eligibility**

Following consultation with team captains a new player eligibility system was successfully trialled in summer comp. Individual player appearances are no longer tracked, rather all players who register by the set deadline are eligible for semi-finals. The new process was successfully implemented for summer season and will continue.

### **Policy Updates**

The Association has developed [Child Risk Management Policy](#) and adopted the Sport Australia [Concussion Guidelines](#) (i.e. HIA). In addition, all junior coach Blue Cards are now formally linked to our organisation via the state government website.

### **Schools Carnivals**

Our tenth running of the Christian Schools Association of Queensland on 6th and 13th March 2020 saw a record 52 teams participating.

### **Juniors**

We have continued to run free junior coaching clinics for 9 to 13 year-olds in four week blocks twice per season (weather and staff permitting), and they have been well attended. Thanks to Hannah Jenkins, Phil Dawson and newcomer Phoebe Cuskelly for running the clinics. They are already providing a pathway for juniors to progress to senior teams once they turn 14.

### **Rules Update**

The Association has adopted the [Eight Edition of the Rules of Touch](#).

### **Affiliation**

The Association held further talks with Touch Football Australia regarding possible affiliation. While they were ultimately unsuccessful much common ground was reached and the matter may be revisited in the near future.

## Representative Games

The BCTA played two more representative games against teams from the [Brisbane City Challenge](#) touch competition. Following our close loss in the inaugural fixture in 2018, BCTA teams won both clashes in 2019 with a 5-2 win at Tennyson in April and a hard-fought 5-4 away win at Cannon Hill in November. Congratulations to all the players who proudly represented us on those occasions.
